I'm looking for a filing and/or statement from the city on the case entitled Ninoos Benjamin V City of Los Angeles. Can you send me something that was filed by the city responding to his claims? Among other things, he asserted that:

- -- there was a "race-based turf war" at the Community Development Department between Latinos and African Americans
- -- staffers were hired based on race not on merit
- -- he faced discrimination as a caucasian Assyrian/Persian
- -- his division was "arbitrarily" ordered to retain three underperforming African American employees
- -- high-level managers hired two underperforming Latinos in order to "counter the all-African American hiring frenzy"

I couldn't find a filing from the city that directly counters Benjamin's (4th) amended complaint. If there isn't paperwork to this effect, can someone in the city attorney's office say whether these claims by Benjamin were accurate? His payout is at City Council today.

- Here is what I have found so far:
- The City's Answer to the Second Amended Complaint filed November 20, 2013, was stipulated to be the Answer to the Third and Fourth Amended Complaints, and in it the City denied all claims and damages.
- The City filed a Motion for Summary Judgment/Adjudication on July 6, 2015 (amended on July 9, 2015), which the Judge Dalila Lyons granted as to all causes of action, including the race based claims, except two Labor Code section claims, one of which Benjamin abandoned before the jury began deliberating.
- The jury returned a verdict of \$758,204.96 on the sole cause of action remaining under Labor Code section 1102.5 for whistleblower retaliation.
- Benjamin asked the jury to return a verdict of \$4,318,399.99 to \$6,818,399.99.
- The payout will be \$750,000 as a settlement.
